Dear Friends in Christ,

Rex Ryan, head coach of the New York Jets, has caught flack for his team's mediocre performances in the past. Being the head coach of a pro football team, and a losing one at that, opens one to criticism. But, recently, the guff was different. Ryan was blasted for leaving the Jets training facility on cutdown day, the day when pro football teams make cuts to finalize their 53-player rosters.

Ryan didn't take off for a round of golf with his buddies or hit the lake for fishing. It was something else. After Coach Ryan personally visited with the players being cut, he went to see his son, Seth, play football. Seth is a walk-on player at Clemson University. The Tigers were facing a big-time SEC stalwart in the Bulldogs from Georgia that Saturday. One National Football League exec described Ryan's decision as, "Really weird. I've never heard of that." Apparently, Rex's dad, Buddy, also a professional coach, didn't make the same decision. Buddy was all business. He never came to one of Rex's games. Somewhere along the way, though, Rex sensed that being a father is as much of a calling as being a football coach.

When those in high profile positions fully commit themselves to their work, we heap praise on them for their dedication and hard work. Every now and then, however, someone in one of these positions surprises us, like Rex Ryan. They have kept a balance between family and work and make decisions based on that equilibrium. Sure, some see them as, "out of whack." Others know that their priorities are straight. Rex Ryan will always remember the empty seat in the grandstands from his ball-playing days, but Seth won't. He'll know that his dad was there for him whether or not he ever gets on the field. Rex Ryan has created a memory, a legacy that every child would be privileged to cherish and uphold. His coaching has extended far beyond the sidelines. So, how about a big "high-five" to Rex Ryan, Seth's daddy?

Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA) is a mission program of PC(USA)

Q: When is our next opportunity to hear about disaster preparedness-and get a free weather radio from the Disaster Preparedness & Response Committee (DPRC)?

A: OCTOBER 4, 2013!! The DPRC will offer "Get Ready! Get Set!", a congregational preparedness workshop, before the presbytery meeting at 1st United Presbyterian Church in Fayetteville. And yes, as long as supplies last, we will distribute free weather radios to attending churches who need a radio.

Disasters will happen in your community and to your congregation. It's not "if" one will happen, it's "when". Preparedness helps take some of the pain out of the disaster by mitigating the effects of the disaster before it happens.

Ray Stephens, a member of Westover Hills Presbyterian in Little Rock, was commissioned during morning worship August 18 as a member of the National Response Team (NRT) of Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA). Interim Pastor Mike Kuner and NRT members Bill and Liz Branch led the commissioning service. Ray was selected in early August through a PDA-led discernment process at Camp Calvin Crest, Fremont, NE. He is available for responding to natural and human-cause disasters throughout the US and Puerto Rico.

DISASTER COMMITTEE NAMES POINTS OF CONTACT FOR CLUSTERS

Here's some help for your cluster and your congregation to recover from and prepare for

disasters. The Presbytery Disaster Preparedness and Response Committee has named one of its members to be YOUR cluster point of contact (POC).

What is the advantage of knowing who your POC is?

1) In the case of a disaster in your church or community, the POC can advocate for you at the presbytery level and help you find the resources you need to recover from the disaster situation.

2) Your POC is a resource on disaster preparedness for both your cluster and your congregations. Please invite your POC to speak - or find a speaker for you - at meetings of your cluster or church.

3) Each year, your POC will call your pastor or clerk to inquire about your congregational disaster preparedness. S/he can help you get information on being better prepared.

RAVE REVIEW from Teaching Elder Sally Johnson, honorably retired and active at Westover Hills Presbyterian, Little Rock on their adult class study:

"A New Kind of Christianity" by Rev. Dr. Brian D. McLaren deals with "Ten Questions That Are Transforming the Faith." These questions are 1) What is the over-arching storyline of the Bible? 2) How should the Bible be understood? 3) Is God violent? 4) Who is Jesus and why is he important? 5) What is the Gospel? 6) What do we do about the Church? 7) Can we find a way to address human sexuality without fighting about it? 8) Can we find a better way of viewing the future? 9) How should followers of Jesus relate to people of other religions? 10) What do we do now? How can we translate our quest into action?



The first five questions deal with basic theological questions of Christian faith that all Christians need to consider and have some basic understanding of because they provide the background we need to deal with the next five questions which address the problems facing the Church of today. Each chapter contains a fairly detailed Bible study of a passage that relates and interprets the question discussed. These studies present some new ways of interpreting these often well-known passages. The entire book is engaging, provocative, and extremely challenging at times. It provides lively group discussions." The Resource Center also has "**A New Kind of Christian**" (Acc. #BK9080) by McLaren.

RAVE REVIEW from Educator Ruth Hamilton, Kirk in the Pines, Hot Springs Village on their just-completed summer study. They used the Resource Center's kit, Adam Hamilton's "**Christianity's Family Tree**" (Acc. #DVD8987, #9524 or #9618) on Christian denominations for eight Thursday mornings. "All those who took the class enjoyed it. We invited church members to speak on their former denominations since all we studied were represented in our congregation. That helped us achieve the objective of appreciating each denomination and the priorities each cherishes."

RAVE REVIEW from General Presbyterian Rev. Dr. Bill Galbraith on the books "**Simply Jesus**" and "**Simply Christianity**", both by N.T. Wright and "**A People's History of Christianity**" by Diana Butler Bass. All three, Bill reports, come highly recommended and are well done and accessible to adult readers.

G-2.1101 Forms of Certified Church Service

Persons may be certified and called to service within congregations, councils and church-related entities, serving in staff position. These individuals endeavor to reflect their faith through their work and to strengthen the church through their dedication. They should be encouraged by their session and presbytery to meet, or be prepared to meet, the certification requirements in a handbook provided by a national certifying body approved by the General Assembly. Names of those who have earned certification through a national certifying body shall be transmitted to the appropriate body of the General Assembly, which will forward them to the stated clerk of the presbyteries in which those persons labor.
