Something Different Before the Presbytery Meeting

I want to invite each of you to come early for the upcoming meeting of Presbytery which will be held on Saturday, June 3 at Second Presbyterian Church in Little Rock. The "early" part will take place on Friday, June 2 at Ferncliff Camp & Conference Center. Rev. Michael Vinson will lead the first in a series of workshops called "Skills for Thriving in Change." This initial workshop is titled "Fostering a Life-Nurturing Environment in Your Congregation." The workshop will begin at 1:00 pm in the new Dining Hall at Ferncliff. There is no cost to attend and after the workshop you will be treated to a sumptuous "burrito bar" catered by Moe's Southwest Grill. The meal will also be without charge as a gift for attending the workshop. Michael has more information about the workshop in an article below.



I write this from a Presbytery Leader Formation conference that is designed to train new leaders serving in presbyteries in the PCUSA. This morning I attended a session on Adaptive Leadership. Adaptive Leadership is the practice of mobilizing people to tackle tough challenges and thrive. If there is a common theme among the group of about 30 presbytery leaders, it is that we are in a season of incredible change. We are in a time of declining resources and the landscape is changing dramatically before our eyes. You are facing tough challenges in your congregations and we are facing tough challenges as a presbytery. Knowing that reality, all of us are facing a need for Adaptive Leadership and making changes in how we operate. I hope this workshop is one that you will consider attending. Unfortunately, Michael doesn't have the magic answer for you to take back to your congregation, but he will give you some tools to take back to begin having these conversations in your congregation.

Another common theme among my colleagues at the conference is a concern about their camp facility. Several are trying to sell their camp and are having difficulty doing so and many find the camp to be a liability instead of an asset. We are very fortunate to be in a very different position. Our presbytery and several congregations and many faithful Presbyterians have made substantial investments of money, time and energy to make Ferncliff one of the premier camp and conference centers in the denomination.

We are inviting people to gather on the evening before the presbytery meeting to enjoy this beautiful space and to spend quality time together in an atmosphere when we are not listening to reports, examining potential candidates for ministry or voting on overtures from the General Assembly. You are invited to come and bring your own snacks and drinks and sit out on the porches at Ferncliff overlooking the lake and enjoy fellowship and conversation with each other. There will be a trivia contest held in the Dining Hall at 7:00 pm with prizes for the winning team. For those who have not seen the new additions to our beautiful camp, you will have an opportunity to tour the Youth Camp, the new pool, Presbyterian Disaster Assistance Warehouse and the newly constructed garden area after the recent storms. Rooms are being offered at a discounted rate of \$79.00 for a single, \$45.00 per



Fostering A Life-Nurturing Environment in Your Congregation



The Presbytery's Future of the Church Ministry Area is sponsoring a workshop Friday afternoon, June 2 beginning at 1 pm at Ferncliff Camp and Conference Center. This workshop is the first of three workshops to be offered by Future of the Church on the theme "Thriving in Change."

Rev. Michael Vinson, Presbytery Resource for Mission Discernment, is the workshop leader for the series. Michael has been engaged by the Presbytery of Arkansas to assist in a number of ways: working to help bridge the work between committees during the Presbytery's reorganization process, identifying needs for ministry, helping committees identify ways to live into their mission, as well as identifying and helping to address issues important to the church and the presbytery during this rapidly changing time. Michael brings us his skills in leadership and organizational development along with the perspective of being a long-standing member of Presbytery, a combination that ensures that the workshops are pertinent to Presbytery at this time.

There is no cost for the workshop and dinner is provided to workshop attendees.

The first workshop for learning how to thrive in change is "Fostering a Life-Nurturing Environment in Your Congregation." Even if you already have a life-nurturing environment in your congregation, times of change can be life-depleting. You may be in a congregation environment that has already lost

ground towards a life-depleting environment with its accompanying stuckness and even conflict. Lifenurturing climates within congregations are more suited to thriving in change. You probably know this.

In this workshop, we will explore some ways to foster a life-nurturing environment. You will get tips and tools to get the conversations started so that your congregation can choose whether it wants to put some time and energy into fostering a life-nurturing environment. These tips and tools, framed within a bigger picture of strengthening the congregation's capacity to thrive in these times of constant (and often rapid) change may be just what the congregation is wanting.

You will also get tips and tools that will assist you if the initial conversations conclude that the congregation does want to invest time and energy to learn to thrive in change. They are simple, easy to understand, and easy to use. The program that Michael bases his work from has as a guiding principle to keep it simple. The premise is that when the tips and tools used are simple, it is possible to handle complexity.

If you want to increase your skills in helping your church thrive in change

If you are concerned that enthusiasm is going down

If you have noticed that there is growing negativity

If you are seeking more willingness by members of your congregation

If you are looking for ways to get "unstuck" and move forward in ministry

If you are ready to get resolution on recurring issues

If you are concerned about loss of membership and finances

Big Tent Conference in St. Louis July 6-8

Grants Available from Presbytery's Mission of the Church Ministry Area

Big Tent 2017 to focus on 'Race, Reconciliation and Reformation'

Presbyterians from around the country are invited to live out their faith at **Big Tent 2017 in St. Louis**, **Missouri**. This biennial gathering will take place **July 6-8**, on the campus of **Washington University**. The theme-Race, Reconciliation and Reformation-will emphasize the hope of the gospel and its power to transform society in the current cultural context marked by anxiety, racial division, political animosity and economic inequality.

Big Tent offers Presbyterians an exciting opportunity to discern some of the toughest concerns of the day, while actively engaging with their faith community.

"Big Tent is one of the finest denominational events put on by the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.)," said **Tony De La Rosa**, Interim Executive Director of the Presbyterian Mission Agency. "Three days of quality programming held in a central, convenient location at a reasonable cost for participants-this

year's Big Tent gathering promises to be among the best ever."

The opening worship preacher will be PC(USA) Stated Clerk, the **Rev. Dr. J. Herbert Nelson II**. The Rev. Dr. Christine Hong, Assistant Professor of Worship and Evangelism and Chapel Worship Coordinator at Louisville Presbyterian Theological Seminary, will be the closing worship preacher.

"As we grapple with the emerging church of the 21st century it is imperative that we come together to listen, learn and envision the future," said Nelson. "God through Jesus Christ is providing us an opportunity at Big Tent to go deep in our theology and faith while renewing our spirits."

Registration is now open and is \$395. The price includes registration, accommodations for three nights and meals. A \$145 rate for commuters is also being offered.

July 14-22, 2017

We will be working on community development teaming up with with First Presbyterian Church of Mount Pleasant, South Carolina. We will mostly be working to build cement homes and also strengthen our relationship with the people and Presbytery of Honduras. We'll be splitting our time between two communities in the Trinidad and Copán regions, where our teams have worked in the past.

Orientation meetings will be set up to prepare everyone for the trip physically, mentally, and spiritually. The estimated cost of the trip is \$1,300/person. Take Advantage of Your Own Power

"They have taken advantage of their own power." So said an official with Presbyterian Self-Development of People about a West Indian village that is learning to be self-sufficient.
