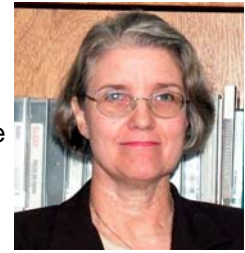

Al Henager, First, Heber Springs writes: In **"Christianity's Family Tree,"** (Acc. #DVD8987 or 9524) Adam Hamilton offers a survey of eight major denominations ranging from the Orthodox to Methodists and most others in between. It contains a DVD of 12 to 15 minute talks on each denomination, along with a study guide, a leader's guide, and a publicity guide. The study offers historical as well and theological insights, focusing mainly on the positive things we can learn from each denominational group. The people of our congregation responded quite positively, and I felt we all grew in our faith as a result of the study."
