

Worshipful Work And the Christ Candle

Opening a Meeting with the Christ Candle

Each meeting should be opened with the lighting of the Christ Candle and the reading of an appropriate scripture. The candle burns throughout the entire meeting, a visual reminder of God's presence.

It is extinguished when adjourning for meals, and at the close of the day the candle is extinguished and prayers are offered to God.

The Christ Candle and a Meeting that Lasts Several Days

The scripture to be used with the Christ Candle for a meeting that lasts several days will provide not only a central focus but continuity.

The Christ Candle, lighted after reading a scripture passage that is related to a meeting theme, acknowledges the light that Jesus brings into the world.

Before adjourning for a meal, read an appropriate scripture, extinguish the candle, and offer the blessing for the meal.

The Candle During the Meeting

Before adjourning for a meal, a scripture is read, the candle is extinguished, and the blessing for the meal is offered. On returning from a meal, a scripture is read, the candle is lighted, and a convening prayer is offered.

Closing the Meeting and Ending the Day

As the meeting is closed, the candle is extinguished and a scripture is read.

Service 2 for Lighting and Extinguishing the Christ Candle

Lighting the Candle

Opening: Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in Christ with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places. In Christ we are marked with the seal of the promised Holy Spirit; this is the pledge of our inheritance toward redemption as God's own people, to praise of the glory of God. (Ephesians 1:3-13)

Service 3 for Lighting and Extinguishing the Christ Candle

Lighting the Candle

Transform us as God's dwelling place.
Christ, you are our peace.
Amen.

Be imitators of God, and live in love as Christ lives in us. The light of Christ!.
