# 2) Authority and Order

- **<u>Ecclesiastical Authority-</u>** The presbytery shall be governed by the most recent edition of the Book of Order of the PC(USA).
- **Presbytery Organization** The presbytery shall maintain written rules, B. policies and procedures in a Ministry Manual. In the event any rule or policy is deemed in conflict with the Book of Order of the PC(USA), the Book of Order shall have precedence.

## 154 4) Officers and Staff

- A. <u>Officers</u>- The officers of the presbytery shall be the Moderator, Vice-Moderator, Treasurer, and Stated Clerk. The presbytery may provide for the election of an assistant Stated Clerk or assistant Treasurer if needed.
  - B. <u>Election-</u> The Moderator and Vice-Moderator shall be elected to a oneyear term at the last meeting of the year preceding the year of service. The Vice-Moderator shall normally be elected to serve as Moderator the following year. The Stated Clerk and assistant Stated Clerk shall be elected to a three-year term at the last meeting preceding the commencement of service.
  - C. <u>Installation-</u> The Moderator and Vice-Moderator shall normally be installed at the first meeting in the year of service.
  - D. <u>Authority-</u> The Moderator shall have such authority as granted by the most recent edition of the Book of Order of the PC(USA) and such other authority granted by vote of the presbytery. The Vice-Moderator shall have the authority to serve in the Moderator's place when the office of Moderator is vacant or when requested by the Moderator. The Stated Clerk shall have such authority as required by the most recent edition of the Book of Order of the PC(USA) and such other authority granted by vote of the presbytery.
  - E. <u>Parity-</u> The office of Moderator shall normally alternate between Ruling and Teaching Elders.
  - F. <u>Vacancy</u>- In the event of vacancy in the office of Moderator, the Vice-Moderator shall serve as Moderator for the remainder of the term of service. In the event of vacancy in the office of Vice-Moderator, a new Vice-Moderator shall be elected at the next stated meeting of the Presbytery. In the event of vacancy in the office of Stated Clerk, the General Committee shall appoint a temporary clerk from among past Stated Clerks or otherwise qualified candidates. The Acting Stated Clerk shall serve until a replacement is elected.
  - G. <u>Staff-</u> The presbytery staff shall normally include an Executive/General Presbyter, Stated Clerk, and Treasurer and may include such other staff approved by the presbytery for the fulfillment of the presbytery's mission and ministry.

## 5) Ministry Areas and Standing Committees

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- Ministries of the Presbytery- In order to more fully and effectively live into its vision, the work of the presbytery shall be partitioned into four broad ministry areas: *Administration, the Church and Its Ministries, the* Mission of the Church, the Future of the Church, and Ministries with Youth, Young Adults, and Campus Ministry. Within these areas, the presbytery shall maintain such committees necessary to carry-out the functions of the presbytery as required by the most recent edition of the Book of Order of the PC(USA) and the vision set forth by the presbytery.
  - Administration The Administration Ministry Area shall oversee the budget and financial operations of the presbytery, act as the Personnel committee of the presbytery, and relate to the constitutionally required committees and commissions of the presbytery,
    - 1. *Membership* One member from each of the regions of the presbytery shall be elected for a three-year term. Terms should be staggered to ensure even distribution over each yearly class. Up to three at-large members may be elected if the principle of representation or a need for specific skills or gifts requires.
    - *Sub-committees and Task Forces-* The Ministry Area may establish such sub-committees and task forces needed to carry out their duties. In no case shall a sub-committee or task force be established for longer than 12 months without the approval of the presbytery or provided by rule.
  - C. The Church and Its Ministries- The Church and Its Ministries Area shall be responsible for oversight of the enrolling and dismissing of Teaching Elders, the call process for congregational ministry, validation of other ministries, the training and oversight of Commissioned Ruling Elders. the oversight of Inquirers and Candidates for ministry, the health and welfare of member congregations in times of need or pastoral transition, and the support and nurture of church professionals.
    - *Permanent Committees* There shall be two permanent committees in the Ministries of the Church Area: the Committee on Leadership Development (CLD) and the Committee on the Church's Ministries (CCM).

260 (3) Regional Cooperation- The unified mission and 261 ministry of the presbytery are essential to the 262 corporate witness of the church. When possible, the 263 work of the presbytery and its ministries and 264 committees should be done in the most 265 representative and inclusive way. This commitment 266 must be balanced by the demands of the geographic diversity of the presbytery. In order to more 267 effectively meet the needs of the presbytery, the 268 269 CCM may organize its routine work regionally 270 provided the final decision on matters of policy. 271 recommendations for presbytery action, and enrollment/dismissal remain with the full 272 273 committee. 274 *Ministry Coordination*- The Leadership of the Church and 275 Ministries of the Church committees should meet together at 276 least annually to review shared goals and priorities and to 277 coordinate their work for the benefit of the whole church. 278 D. *The Church and Its Mission*- The Church and Its Mission Area provides 279 oversight, planning, and support for programs that connect our 280 congregations in practicing our faith through mission and outreach. 281 Christian education, and spiritual development. The Mission of the 282 Church Area will provide guidance and resources to help connect 283 congregations in mission and ministry. 284 1. *Membership*- Two members from each of the regions of the presbytery shall be elected for a three-year term. Up to five at-285 large members may be elected if the principle of representation 286 287 or a need for specific skills or gifts requires. The Moderator of 288 Presbyterian Women or her designee shall be a member with 289 voice and vote. 290 2. <u>Sub-committees and Task Forces-</u> The Ministry Area may establish 291 such sub-committees and task forces needed to carry out their 292 duties. In no case shall a sub-committee or task force be established for longer than 12 months without the approval of 293 294 the presbytery unless provided by rule.

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3. *Permanent Sub-Committee-* One permanent sub-committee of no less than five (ideally one from each of the regions) members shall be elected for the Disaster Preparedness Sub-Committee.

298 4. *Other Relating Entities*- Unless otherwise required by charter or 299 covenant with the Presbytery, all partner agencies (i.e. Ferncliff, 300 PW, Presbyterian Pilgrimage, etc.) shall report to the presbytery 301 through the Church and Its Mission Area. 302 E. *Ministries with Youth, Campus, and Young Adults-* The Committee on 303 Ministries with Youth, Campus, and Young Adults shall oversee the ministry of the church with middle school and high school youth, 304 college and campus based ministries within the bounds of the 305 306 presbytery, and ministries with Young Adults up to age 35. 307 *Membership*- Two members from each of the regions of the 308 presbytery shall be elected for a three-year term. One member 309 from each UKIRK registered campus ministry with voice and 310 vote. Two members of the Youth Advisory Team shall be 311 appointed by the Youth Advisory Team to serve with voice and 312 vote. 313 2. <u>Sub-committees and Task Forces-</u> The Ministry Area may establish 314 such sub-committees and task forces needed to carry out their 315 duties. In no case shall a sub-committee or task force be established for longer than 12 months without the approval of 316 the presbytery. 317 318 3. <u>Permanent Sub-Committees-</u> Two permanent sub-committees 319 shall be appointed to oversee Youth and Campus ministries 320 respectively. 321 Youth Ministry Team: The Youth Ministry shall consist of 322 youth and adults from across the presbytery. The Youth 323 Ministry Team shall establish a process to annually invite 324 youth and adults to join the team. 325 *The Campus Ministry Sub-Committee:* The Campus Ministry 326 Sub-committee shall consist of representatives from each 327 UKirk registered campus ministry or congregation-based 328 campus ministry within the bounds of the presbytery and 329 others appointed by the Ministries with Youth, Campus, and 330 Young Adults committee.

*The Future of the Church Ministry Area-* The Future of the Church serves 332 as a catalyst to engage congregations and Presbytery Ministry Areas in 333 creative thinking and planning beyond current models of ministry and programming to meet the challenges of new demographics and trends 334 335 as society continues to change. The Future of the Church area assists 336 with visioning, branding, technology, and development of new 337 ministries. It provides new church development functions of the 338 Presbytery. 339 1. *Membership*- Two members from each of the regions and six at-340 large members shall be elected to three year terms. 341 2. <u>Sub-committees and Task Forces-</u> The Ministry Area may establish 342 such sub-committees and task forces needed to carry out their 343 duties. In no case shall a sub-committee or task force be 344 established for longer than 12 months without the approval of 345 the presbytery. 346 G. Required Committees- The presbytery shall maintain the following 347 committees and commissions to meet constitutional requirements: a 348 Permanent Judicial Commission, a Committee on Representation, a 349 Nominating Committee, and such other committees and commissions 350 required by the most recent edition of the Book of Order of the 351 PC(USA). 352 H. Coordinating Team- The Coordinating Team shall serve as the 353 coordinating and program oversight body of the presbytery between 354 meetings. When necessary, the Coordinating Team may act on behalf of 355 the presbytery for routine business or when a called, special, or regular 356 meeting of the presbytery is impractical. 357 *Membership*- There shall be no more than 17 and no fewer than 358 10 members of the Coordinating Team. 359 a) Members from Ministry Areas: Two elected members from 360 each of the four ministry areas shall be elected each January to represent that area on the Coordinating Team. 361 362 b) At-Large Members: Five additional members shall be elected 363 from the presbytery (no more than two from any region.) 364 Three additional at-large members may be elected to meet

the principles of representation and parity.

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c) Moderator: The Moderator of the Coordinating Team shall be 367 the most recent Moderator of the Presbytery. S/he shall serve 368 with voice and vote. In the event the most recent past 369 moderator is unable or unwilling to serve, the Nominations 370 Committee shall bring a name to the presbytery to fill the role of 371 Moderator of the Coordinating Team. The nominee will 372 normally come from the roster of past moderators. 373 d) Ex-officio Members: The General/Executive Presbyter, 374 Treasurer, Stated Clerk, Moderator of Presbytery, and Vice-Moderator of Presbytery shall be ex-officio members with 375 voice but not vote. Other ex-officio members may be 376 377 provided for by policy. 378 e) Geographic Limitations: At no time shall more than three 379 voting members of Coordinating Team be from the same 380 geographic region. 381 Terms- Terms of service shall be for two years. The terms of 2. 382 Ministry Area representatives and at-large members should be staggered to ensure consistent representation and continuity of 383 384 leadership. Members may be elected for up to two successive 385 terms. No member may serve for more than four consecutive 386 years without approval of the presbytery. 387 I. *Nominations and Elections-* The presbytery shall provide by rule for the 388 nomination and election of members to serve on all permanent 389 committees, sub-committees, and commissions. The principles of 390 representation and parity shall apply to all committees, sub-391 committees, commissions, task forces, and other extensions of the 392 presbytery. 393 Additional and at-Large Members of Committees: When the J. 394 Organization and Structure provides for the option of additional 395 members, a committee may request that the Nominating Committee put 396 forward the name(s) of at-large members to meet particular needs of 397 the committee. The Nominating Committee may, at its own discretion, 398 also put forward at-large members for election if the committee deems 399 it necessary to meet the demands of representation and parity. 400 Representation and Parity- The principles of representation and parity K. 401 shall apply to all committees, sub-committees, commissions, task forces, 402 and other extensions of the presbytery. 403 404 405 406

## 6) Standing Rules

- A. *Definition-* A standing rule of the Presbytery is any action of the Presbytery of a general nature that will govern the actions of Presbytery for an indefinite period of time. Standing rules may order the operations of Presbytery; elaborate on existing policies and practices; direct its officers, staff, or agencies; establish procedures; or provide any kind of specific guidance. However, they must be within the framework of existing policies of the Presbytery; they may not establish policy nor modify parliamentary procedure. Policy is established by this Manual or by specific procedures established by the Manual.
- B. *Expiration*- Any action of the Presbytery that meets the definition of standing rule, but which is not so identified and numbered in the minutes will expire one year from the date of its passage, unless readopted.
- C. Records- The Stated Clerk will keep a Compendium of Standing Rules, numbering each chronologically, or by another numbering system, assigning each a number immediately after passage, which number will appear in the minutes.

The list of Standing Rules should not be renumbered following repeal of a rule. When a rule expires or is repealed, a note shall be added to the Compendium in place of the rule.

#### 7) Incorporation 449 450 A. *Incorporation*- The Presbytery of Arkansas is incorporated as a not for 451 profit ecclesiastical corporation in accordance with the constitution of 452 the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) as well as in compliance with the laws of the State of Arkansas, and in conformity with appropriate sections of 453 454 the Federal Internal Revenue Code. 455 B. *Meetings of the Corporation*- Meetings of the presbytery shall be 456 meetings of the corporation. 457 C. Officers- Officers of the corporation shall be the moderator and stated clerk of the Presbytery of Arkansas. 458 459 D. *Counselor-at-Law-* The presbytery shall elect a counselor-at-law and may elect associate counselors-at-law, each of whom shall be active 460 members of churches in the Presbytery of Arkansas. Terms shall be for 461 462 three years and reelection shall be permitted. 463 The counselor shall be an advisory member of the Coordinating Team of 464 the presbytery, and shall advise the Coordinating Team and the presbytery on such legal matters as may become of concern to the 465 466 Coordinating Team and the presbytery. The counselor may seek the advice and assistance of the associate counselors when necessary. 467 468 The counselor and associate counselors shall serve without compensation, but they shall be reimbursed for such reasonable 469 470 expenses as they may from time to time incur. 471 The counselor may, at the direction of the presbytery, retain or employ 472 such additional attorneys as may be deemed necessary to represent the 473 presbytery from time to time. 474 475 476 477

#### 8) Amendment 478

479 Amendments- The Ministry Manual may be amended by vote of the A. 480 presbytery as follows: 481 Amending Organization and Structure- The **Organization and** 482 **Structure** section may be amended by 3/5 vote of the 483 presbytery present and voting if the proposed amendment is 484 distributed to all members and member congregations no less than 30 days prior to the meeting during which the vote is to 485 486 take place. This rule may be waived by a 2/3 vote of the 487 presbytery present and voting. 488 2. Ministry Duties and Presbytery Policies- The Ministry Duties and Presbytery Policies sections may be amended by majority vote 489 of the presbytery. 490 491 3. Standing Rules- A Standing Rule may be adopted by a 3/5 vote of 492 the Presbytery present and voting. 493 *Covenants and Partnerships*- Once adopted by the presbytery, all 4. 494 covenants and partnership agreements shall be deemed added 495 to the Ministry Guide. 496 B. Suspension- A particular provision of this manual may be suspended by 497 a 2/3 vote of the presbytery. No provision may be suspended if such suspension violates the Book of Order of the Presbyterian Church 498 499 (USA). 500 C.. Editorial Changes- The Stated Clerk shall provide for annual review of 501 this Manual and its contents. The Stated Clerk, in consultation with the 502 Moderator and General Presbyter, is empowered to make minor 503 changes to correct grammar or spelling, to eliminate redundancies, or 504 to make such changes necessitated by action of the General Assembly of 505 the PC(USA) or the GAPIC. Any changes (other than scrivener's 506 corrections) shall be reported to the presbytery at its next stated 507 meeting. At least annually, the Stated Clerk shall provide each Clerk of 508 Session in the presbytery the updated contents to this manual.
